Measuring the Impact of Music Mentorship

ArtSmart's 2023 Longitudinal Study in partnership with the WCG Institutional Review Board shows a causal link between ArtSmart participation and increased plans to attend college, having a meaningful connection with an adult, and having an adult to talk to when stressed or having problems. We are committed to measuring ArtSmart's impact year over year through our annual student and mentor surveys. In this section, you will find results from our 2023-2024 program year surveys.















ArtSmart partners with the Adirondacks-based nonprofit We Are Instrumental to provide music lessons and mentorship to students throughout the region, who could not otherwise access lessons due to geographical barriers and financial constraints.






Colin SharpFranklin Learning Center








INCLUSION, DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND ACCESS

ArtSmart was founded on the principles embodied by the acronym IDEA. ArtSmart's mission was created to provide inclusion, equity, and access in music education to a diverse student body in historically under-resourced communities. We believe that integrating IDEA values into the daily operations of ArtSmart is an ongoing journey. Each day, we actively engage with our community, assess our systems, and adapt to better meet its needs. ArtSmart adopts a grassroots approach, prioritizing feedback from those on the ground-the Maria Manetti Shrem Mentors, students, and program partners. We continually evaluate our curriculum and organizational structure to ensure they align with the needs of our community. Our efforts extend to fostering diversity and representation among our mentors, staff, and leadership. IDEA is not just a set of values but a dynamic process rooted in action. It permeates every aspect of ArtSmart's work, guiding our decisions and initiatives. As we continue to evolve, we remain committed to the ongoing narrative of advancing inclusion, diversity, equity, and access in music education.

ArtSmart has expanded identity and trauma-informed mentor training and development resources to support the diverse needs of our students. With increasing numbers of ArtSmart students identifying as non-binary, facing mental health challenges, or having disabilities, we are dedicated to building our team's skills and knowledge to affirm and empower them.





Expanded Resources

- In Summer 2024, veteran Maria Manetti Shrem Mentor Katya Powder developed a new mentor training module: "De-Gendering Vocal Anatomy & Teaching the Non-Binary/Trans Voice."
- In Early 2025, ArtSmart plans to host a live mentor training session on Katya's work.
- In Spring 2025, ArtSmart mentor, Site Ambassador, and Curriculum Consultant, Shelley Mitchell will lead mentors in a session on "Implementing Mindfulness and Inquiry in the Studio."
- In 2025, ArtSmart intends to invite a guest speaker to lead a session on how best to support LGBTQIA+ students as they navigate the current social and political atmosphere.
- **During the 2024-25 season,** ArtSmart plans to purchase and incorporate more music by female composers and composers of color into its sheet music library.

Through these comprehensive efforts in leadership diversity, inclusive programming, and culturally responsive training, ArtSmart demonstrates an unwavering commitment to embedding anti-racism, equity, and inclusion into the very fabric of our organization, ensuring that our work continues to evolve and strengthen in service of all communities we reach.
